WIRELESS NEWS BULLETIN.

APPRECIATION OF THE POSITION.

Home Office reports from all parts of the country this morning indicates that the position yesterday was quieter than on any previous day of the strike. The Government's energetic protective methods, prompt and severe Police Court action and the restraining influence of responsible Trade Union leaders have effectively suppressed rowdyism. There have been more defections from the ranks of the strikers, the position as a whole is still one of deadlock.

LONDON AND HOME COUNTIES

Convoys came through yesterday without accident. A large crowd at Limehouse tried to interfere with a lorry loaded with fish oil. Stones and bottles were thrown, and the crowd was dispersed by mounted and foot police.

Provinces quiet, a number of men are returning to work, and the police are dealing effectively with disturbances.

WOOLWICH ARSENAL

There were no pickets at the gates of Woolwich Arsenal this morning, and a huge number of workers estimated at thousands returned to work this morning.

PEACE MOVES

The special meeting of the General Council of the T.U.C. adjourned soon after 1.30 this morning. It is understood that the General Council and the Miners Executive will continue their session at 10 a.m. this morning. No statement was made at the adjournment, and there is said to be no change in the situation.
