WIRELESS NEWS BULLETIN.

A message has been received from 10, Downing Street to the effect that the Government have no power to compel employers to take back every man who has been on strike.

Attention is however drawn to the hope expressed by the Prime Minister in his statement in the House of Commons that we should resume our work in a spirit of co-operation, putting behind us all malice and all vindictiveness.

The best course is for the various trade unions to get into immediate touch with the association of employers concerned, in order that, if possible, a satisfactory agreement may be reached.

EMERGENCY FOOD SERVICE.

All Emergency Food Services in common with other Emergency Services are being continued for the present. Convoys of food stuffs will be run daily. The milk pool in Hyde park will continue.

L.N.E.R.

The L.N.E.R. are at present running the emergency schedule of trains, which they brought into operation during the course of yesterday. Every effort is being made to resume regular services of passenger trains as soon as possible. Yesterday the L.N.E.R. operated 1,276 trains, including 171 freight trains.

UNDERGROUND RAILWAY.

The services provided on the Underground system yesterday are being maintained to-day, and the following additional facilities have been introduced:-

Charing Cross station on the Hampstead Line and South Kensington station on the Piccadilly line are now open.

The District extended their service from the Mansion House to Mark Lane and Whitechapel. Trains will be run at 15 min. intervals.

L.G.O.C., the London United, Metropolitan Electric and the South Metropolitan Electric Tramway systems are running to-day.

TRANSPORT WORKERS UNION.

The Transport Workers Union announces that it has been decided to respond to the Prime Minister's appeal and the Union's Officers have been authorised to meet employers to make satisfactory arrangements to return to work.

POSITION OF THE PRINTERS.

Many printers are still out. At the Head quarters of the National Society of Operative Printers and Assistants to-day, it was stated that the Society yesterday informed the London Newspaper Proprietors that the men were available and waited the Proprietors' wishes, but were informed, however, that no papers were being printed last night, and were unable to obtain any information about to-day's evening papers. They also approached the General Printing Trade. No definite instructions were received. The Unions are meeting to-day to consider the position.
